Safe School, Safe Community provides 1,000 helmets to Thai primary school at launch 17 July 2018 – Bangkok, Thailand

Students, parents, and teachers at Wat Rachasingkorn School received 1,000 helmets to officially launch the *Safe School, Safe Community* program. The program is being implemented by AIP Foundation and supported by the Australian Road Research Board (ARRB) and Rotary International. Pre-implementation surveys showed that Wat Rachasingkorn School had a helmet-wearing rate of only 1%.

"In Thailand, road crashes are one of the deadliest challenges we face today," said Suwat Tansathein, Director of Bang Kho Laem District. "Programs like Safe School, Safe Community play a crucial role in increasing road safety for our most vulnerable road users such as school children and their families."

Over 450 participants attended the launch ceremony, including students, parents, teachers, government representatives, and other guests. Representatives from ARRB, Rotary International, AIP Foundation, and the government gave speeches at the ceremony, followed by a road safety performance from the students. Local traffic police and donor representatives provided an interactive helmet-wearing demonstration on stage.

"As experts in the field of road and transport issues, providing helmets can have a significant impact on reducing the rates of road crash injuries and fatalities," said David Milling, Senior Technology Leader, Safe Systems and Human Factors at Australian Road Research Board (ARRB). "The Safe School, Safe Community program is an opportunity for us to address this key issue."

At the ceremony, the Rotary Club of Srapathum also presented awards to the winners of a school wide competition on the theme of "Road Safety in My Community." The competition included coloring, essay writing, and public speaking categories. Three students were declared winners in each category.

"As countries like Thailand continue to increase the use of mobilized transport, we must play our part to encourage safe habits that will keep our children protected on the roads," said Wandee Aroonsangmanee, President of the Rotary Club of Srapathum.

"The Safe School, Safe Community program is Rotary's first Global Grant promoting road safety for children. Prevention of road crashes will continue to be a priority for us as we work to create lasting change in communities," said Dr. Sílvia Shrubsall, Member of the International Committee, Rotary Club Matilda Bay.

Over the course of the program, *Safe School, Safe Community* will provide three trainings and one extracurricular activity to members of the Wat Rachasingkorn School community. The initiative aims to increase helmet use among children to better protect them from head injury and raise public awareness of the importance of child quality helmet use.

"Helmets have been scientifically proven to decrease the likelihood of death or injury in a crash," said Oratai Junsuwanaruk, Thailand Country Manager of AIP Foundation. "These families may have limited road safety knowledge or resources, but thanks to the *Safe School, Safe Community* program, their children will be protected."
