AIP Foundation and UPS Helmets for Kids project continues to protect students

30 May, 2014 - Kandal, Cambodia

On March 21, 2014, Ieng Thaivirak, a 4th grade student at KorKi Primary School in Kandal Province was riding his bicycle home from school when he was struck by a speeding motorcycle. Thaivirak fell and hit his head on the pavement. The 10-year-old boy would have suffered serious head injuries, but his helmet saved his life. One week after the incident, Thaivirak was able to ride to and from school as usual.

Ieng Thaivirak is one of 2,760 students in Cambodia who received a helmet last school year under the *Helmets for Kids* project sponsored by The UPS Foundation. Since 2012, the non-profit Asia Injury Prevention (AIP) Foundation has worked together with The UPS Foundation at three schools in Kandal and Kampong Speu Provinces to donate helmets and provide road safety education to students and teachers.

"Our students are at risk every day, sharing their route to and from school with high volumes of speeding motorcycles, cars, buses, and trucks. *Helmets for Kids* provides students with life-saving road safety knowledge which they can apply to their daily lives," said Mrs Nhem Ly, Principal of Kor Ki Primary School.

"Marking the third anniversary of the United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety, we are proud to contribute another 913 helmets today to protect students and teachers from head injuries when they commute to school", said Red Ramirez, Manager of Authorised Service Contractors, UPS Asia Pacific.
